Discovering our Christian symbols

If you look around older churches, you will often notice symbols in the stained glass windows, carved in the pews, or painted on the walls ... But *what do they mean?* There is a rich heritage of artistic symbols that help us to understand our faith—if we understand what they are saying!



The “Chi-Rho”: Pronounced exactly like the name of the capital city of Egypt (Cairo), this symbol is made up of two Greek letters, *Chi* (Roughly a hard “ch” or “k” sound) and *Rho* (which looks like a P but is actually the Greek letter R!). Together, they are the first two letters of the name “Christ” in ancient Greek (ΧΡΙΣΤΟΣ =“Christos”). Since very ancient times, Christians have used this abbreviation as a symbol for Jesus. Contrary to popular assumption, “Christ” isn’t Jesus’ second name; it’s actually the Greek translation of the Hebrew word for “the Anointed One” or “the Messiah”. In Jesus’ case, it’s actually a *title*: He is “Jesus the Christ” or “Jesus the Messiah”.



The “IHS” is another widespread symbol, but it has been interpreted in many different ways, in different languages. It was sometimes believed to represent the Latin phrase *Jesus hominum salvator* (Jesus, Saviour of humanity). In English, some people assumed it was the initials for phrases like “I have suffered” or “I have saved”. In reality, this is another Greek-based symbol, since the letters IHS actually represent the Greek letters *Iota*, *Eta* and *Sigma* (I, H and Σ), the first three letters of the name of Jesus in Greek (ΙΗΣΟΥΣ=*Iésous*).
