Black Canadian Heroes Assembly: Grades 3 to 8 : Gym in use all day

Babarinde Williams, founder of Drums et al, is an award winning motivational speaker, singer, and talented musician. He was born in Nigeria and now facilitates African drumming, music events, and education programs throughout Ontario and internationally.

The Black Canadian Heroes Assembly chronicles the lives and times of Canadians of African descent. From the activities of Mathieu de Costa (first recorded black person in Canada) to the heroic deeds of figures of the underground railroad, students will learn about the activities and contributions of black heroes like Josiah Henson (Uncle Tom) and Harriet Tubman, Black inventors and scientists like Elijah McCoy, and Dr. Anderson Ruffin Abbott (the first licensed Canadian-born black physician). The contributions of war heroes like Richard Pierpont (brave black loyalist soldier) and William Hall (first Black Canadian sailor as well as the first Black Canadian to receive the Victoria Cross) will also be discussed to ensure the labours of past heroes were not in vain.

Tales by Moonlight Workshop with Barbarinde Williams: Kindergarten to Grade 2

This workshop simulates the ancient African tradition of gathering children under the moonlight for the exercise of storytelling and the cognitive exercise of solving riddles. The program uses the African cultural art of Storytelling, Dance and Hand Drumming to teach, educate and motivate students. The audience will participate in simple call and response songs, percussion, and dance. Tales of Ananse, Ijapa and other characters will be told. This is to give a kaleidoscope view of Africa from the eyes of an African child. It is also meant to explain the many reasons why things are as they are in our world.


